After the second session, a group of parents mingled and exchanged challenges for nearly an hour! One of many that things we pride ourselves on at TSIS is personalising the schooling experience and being responsive to the unique needs of each child and family. We are acutely aware of the different developmental needs of our students at each stage of their growth. It is this philosophy that has led us to developing an innovative approach to educating and supporting students in Year 7 and Year 8 as they transition to senior school while navigating through early adolescence.

### Spotlight on Sikhism for our Sikh Students

TSIS's Sikh students follow the Akaal Sahai Curriculum with the main aim of inculcating 'Chardikala' - the ability to remain positive throughout any given circumstance.

At our senior campus, Sikh students start each day with Japji Sahib (prayer). Recently, a Sikh display board was placed outside the school's Gurdwara to share information about upcoming special Sikh events like Gurpurab, Gurgaddi Diwas and Jyoti Jyot Diwas.

Sikh children at our junior campus assemble each morning to begin their day with 5 pauris (verses) of the Japji Sahib. Teachers also share Sakhiyaan (Sikh history) and the reasons behind Sikh traditions like Mathatek (bowing to the holy scripture) and Vand Ke Chakna (helping the needy).
